Day	Pray for	Explanation
Monday	Ministry	Boldness to share the Message; witness to local people; visiting local people; teaching and preaching; discernment; creativity in planning projects; functioning of equipment – printers computers, projectors, vehicles, etc.
Tuesday	Teams	Sending team –home church; financial support team; prayer support team; family; marriage and children; schooling; building new friendships with local people; parents at home. <u>Team</u> : bonding, care for each other, love, servanthood.
Wednesday	Well-being	Health; emotional life; overcome loneliness; lack of accustomed fellowship; housing; lack of privacy; adapt to foreign environment; grow in love for local people, communication with home church, family and supporters.
Thursday	Training	Language study, understanding culture, getting to know task and responsibilities, training of new believers.
Friday	Field	Local Christians & church, leadership of the church, breaking down the strongholds of the enemy, country leaders, government, open hearts, people group to come to faith.
Saturday	Safety	Government, political situation, visas, doors to remain open, safety in travel, security and protection for those in hostile countries.
Sunday	Spiritual life	Quiet time of missionary – his/her personal relationship with the Lord, prayer life, living a victorious life in Christ, wisdom, discernment, compassion, fullness of the Holy Spirit, enthusiasm and perseverance, the local church.

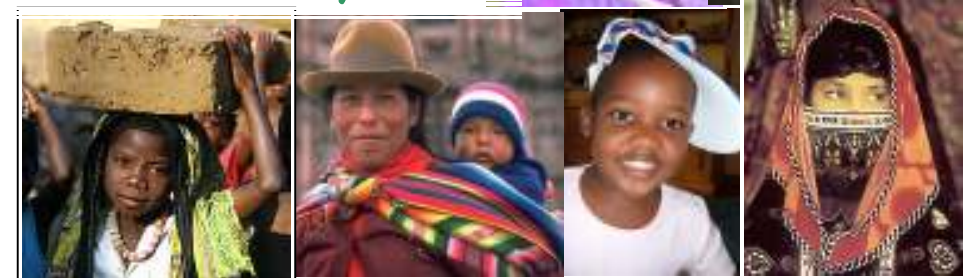

When we pray "Hallowed be Your name, Your kingdom come" we are praying for Missions. The full answer to the second request accomplishes the first, and if we pray the first from the depths of hearts which are passionately jealous for God's name we will be urgent in praying for His kingdom to come.

Every Christian must be praying for Missions for otherwise they show no jealousy for God's name. Every local church should consider praying for the gospel's effect worldwide as at the very core of its ministry. God is worthy to be known and glorified by people throughout the world – that involves proclaiming Him and praying for those who are especially equipped to proclaim Him.

Every Christian who has had the privilege of receiving good teaching in a faithful Christ-saturated Bible-centred church should consider using the knowledge God has given him or her in ministry at home or in another country – the best equipped people to proclaim Christ are those who know Him best: historically it is clear that the compulsive desire to go out as a missionary originates in a passion for praying for the work of God's kingdom worldwide.

The information for prayer in these pages is the tip of the iceberg – please be professional and urgent in your praying, seeking new and current information and giving thanks in all circumstances. If you are laid aside with illness or old-age, or if you are unemployed, thank God that you have been released to pray more zealously for Missions. If you are stuck for hours on the highway on a regular basis, thank God that you have been given more time to pray for Missions. If you have e-mail, thank God that you can update with regular news so you can pray more effectively and encourage missionaries in writing. Give thanks in all circumstances... and pray continually.

They are serving with SIM, a missions agency. The Yao people are Muslims, one of the least evangelised peoples of the world. There are very few believers among them. Daniel and Jonathan are with them, Sara and Madeleine are in Fishhoek.

Low morality is a big problem on the island; promiscuity, marijuana and alcohol abuse are common.
